

The Radiation Injury Treatment Network (RITN) comprises of medical centers in the management of bone marrow failure which are preparing to care for patients with Acute Radiation Syndrome following a mass casualty disaster.

RITN hospitals are paid an unrestricted grant for the following activity:

- Annual tasks: Administrative (task reporting, quarterly webinar, etc.),
   Exercise (participate in an RITN facilitated web-based TTX), Education (several options available)
- •Quarterly WebEx meeting (1 hour)
- ·Participation in ad hoc projects as available
- •Annual time commitment (dependent on how involved you want to be):

oPrimary MD - 5-15 hours

oPrimary coordinator - 10-20 hours

oSecondary coordinator - 5-10 hours

oEmergency manager - 5-20 hours
